From Cell Culture to Human Culture: Translating What We Learn in a Dish to Improve Societal Health

This is such an exciting time to be a nurse scientist! The breadth and depth of nursing research includes basic and translational science designed to improve health. Historically, bench scientists focus on identifying new biomarkers for disease or developing novel therapeutic agents in isolation with little to no clinician input. Clinician scientists conduct descriptive studies, biobehavioral interventions or randomized controlled clinical trials. Often, these studies lack rigorous biological and genetic measures that could provide mechanistic insight into underlying disease processes or drug responses. Collectively, these strategies have not resulted in a high level of return on research funding investment. Newer models, focused on translation, are iterative in nature and involve interprofessional collaborative teams, resulting in acceleration of bench findings to the clinic and back. Nurse scientists are ideally suited to join and lead interprofessional teams that can answer fundamental mechanistic questions at the bench, translate those findings to clinical practice and then shape and influence the policy agenda. In this presentation, examples of team science from the University of Maryland Center for Pain Studies will be used to highlight translational approaches to improve health.

Connecting the Dots: Building Healthy Community Through Research

Despite tremendous progress over the last decade that has been made in improving health in the U.S., many ethnic minority populations still experience significant health disparity gaps that stem from both a paucity of valid research and a lack of a culturally sensitive service infrastructure.

Community based participatory research (CBPR) is a methodology that requires active community involvement in the processes that shape the development of research and intervention strategies, as well as in the implementation, evaluation and dissemination of research studies. CBPR and other participatory methodologies are being applied increasingly in a variety of areas in health research. These areas include health needs assessment, evaluation model development, and health service planning and development.

Dr. Kim will also cover her professional and scientific journey over the past decade which has focused on the development of a strong program of research focusing on CBPR as a means of reducing health disparities among traditionally underserved ethnic minority populations. Dr. Kim's research program examines the effectiveness of self care strategies for improving health outcomes and overcoming racial, ethnic and social disparities in healthcare. Using an immigrant community as a community laboratory to build sound translational science, her recent work has focused on Korean Americans.

Dr. Kim has conducted several descriptive studies to explore and better define barriers and facilitators to equitable care for this racial and ethnic minority population. She has also led six intervention trials to test various self care strategies to improve cardiovascular health outcomes, (R15) funded by the National Institute of Nursing Research, (twoR01s) funded by the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ) and Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute (NHLBI), (R34, R18) funded by National Institute of Digestive, Diabetic and Kidney Disease (NIDDK).

Dr. Kim will share lessons learned from her CBPR research process that links community building strategies and health outcomes for individuals from underserved communities. She will also share strategies for building an effective program of research that continues to inform both researchers and clinicians about finding community based evidence materials that deliver high quality, equitable care to increasingly diverse patient populations.
